How will my data be used?

Grants data submitted to our <u>Advancing Human Rights: Knowledge Tools for Funders</u> initiative will be accessible via:

- Foundation Maps: Human Rights, a password-protected, funder-only tool
- The main version of <u>Foundation Maps</u>, and other subscription-based Foundation Center products for a limited audience (including funders, NGO staff, researchers)

The <u>Advancing Human Rights website</u>, which is publicly accessible, does not include grants-level data. The website provides aggregate statistics, sample grants (with prior approval by the funder), and top 25 funder lists by issue area, population, and region. The website also lists all foundations who submitted data for the project. <u>See below</u> for more information about the Foundation Center's data use practices.

How can I ensure my data is safe?

The safety of human rights advocates is of utmost importance to Ariadne, Foundation Center, IHRFG, and the International Network of Women's Funds. We are eager to work with you to ensure the security of your information.

For any grants that might affect a grantee's safety, please **note the recipient as "Anonymous" and provide only the details that you and the grantee are comfortable sharing.** We encourage you to send us information about sensitive grants to the extent possible, as it enables us to map funding for some of the most challenging issues and contexts. We also encourage you to ensure that your grantees are comfortable with any information being shared.

If you are concerned about your foundation being named, we can list you as an "Anonymous" funder, and your name will not be shared in the research, tools, or top funder lists.

We also understand that contexts can change quickly, and a grant that seems safe when submitted can become sensitive later.
